Partners in every sense of the word, John Littleton and Kate Vogel have been collaborating for over twenty years. They are internationally known for their Bag Series, colorful glass sculptures that resemble either groupings of bags or smaller bags fitted within a larger, more transparent bag. John's father, Harvey Littleton, originated the studio-glass movement in the United States. Kate Vogel was studying printmaking at the University of Wisconsin when she met John. Following a trip to Murano Italy, Kate embraced glass. Their work is in public and private collections in North America, Europe, and Asia. They have been spotlighted in magazines, newspapers, television, and, most recently, are featured artists in the film "The Blue Ridge Parkway - America's Favorite Journey" showing at the Blue Ridge Parkway Destination Center.
