Jane Sauer's textiles are the product of her experiences as an educator, a gallerist, and a protestor. Sauer's highly political work addresses the sanitization of systems of violence using quilting and embroidery, applying vintage techniques to household objects associated with covering up and making one presentable.

Sauer is a two-time National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) fellow and collected nationally and internationally including 24 museum collections. Outside of the studio Sauer has served on several boards and advisory committees, including the Craft Emergency fund, University of Sante Fe, National Council for the School of Art, Washington University, as Chair of the Board for The American Craft Council (ACC) and owner of Jane Sauer Gallery in Santa Fe from 2005-2014.
